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
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Getting started

Device layout





- Do not cover the antenna area with your hands or other objects. This may cause connectivity problems or drain the battery.
- Do not allow water to contact the Display. The Display may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.

USIM Card

USIM Card is an IC card containing customer and authentication information, including phone number.

Handling USIM Card


- Customer is responsible for any damage caused by inserting USIM Card in an other-brand IC card reader, etc. SoftBank Mobile Corp. is not responsible in such case.
- Always keep the IC chip (metal) clean.
- Wipe clean with a dry, soft cloth.
- Avoid applying labels. May damage USIM Card.
- See instructions included with USIM Card for handling.
- USIM Card is the property of SoftBank Mobile Corp.
- USIM is replaceable (at cost) in case of loss/damage.
- Return USIM Card to SoftBank Mobile Corp. when cancelling subscription.
- Returned USIM Cards are recycled for environmental purposes.
- Note that USIM Card specifications and performance may change without notice.
- It is recommended that you keep a separate copy of information that is saved on USIM Card. SoftBank Mobile Corp. is not responsible for damages from saved information that is lost.
- Always follow emergency procedures to suspend service if your USIM Card or device (USIM Card inserted) is lost/stolen. For details, contact Customer Service.
- Always power off device before inserting/removing USIM Card.

Inserting the USIM Card

Pay attention to the position and direction of the USIM Card when inserting it.



- See instructions included with the USIM Card in regard to handling the USIM Card.
- Always power off the device before inserting/removing USIM Card.
- 1 Open the cover of the USIM Card slot
- 2 Insert the USIM Card with the gold-colored contacts facing downwards




3 Push the USIM Card into the slot until it locks in place



- Do not insert a SD Card into the USIM Card slot.
- Use caution not to lose or let others use the USIM Card. SoftBank Mobile Corp. is not responsible for any damage or inconvenience caused by lost or stolen USIM cards.
- 4 Close the cover of the USIM Card slot

Removing the USIM Card

- 1 Open the cover of the USIM Card slot
- 2 Push the USIM Card until it disengages from the device, and then pull it out



3 Close the cover of the USIM Card slot

Charging the battery

Charge the battery before using this device for the first time or if you haven't used it for a long time.



The AC Charger is optional. Use the SoftBank-approved AC Charger Micro USB 1.0 A (ZTDAC1) or Micro USB 1.8 A (ZTDAD1). See the SoftBank Website for other peripheral devices. If you use an unapproved AC Charger, it may cause the Internal Battery to explode or damage the device.



- When the battery power is low, the battery icon appears empty.
- If the battery is completely discharged, the device cannot be turned on immediately when the AC Charger is connected. Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before turning on the device.
- If you use multiple applications at once, or applications that need a connection to another device, the battery will drain quickly. To avoid disconnecting from the network or losing power during a data transfer, always use these applications after fully charging the battery.


Charging with the AC Charger

This section explains how to charge the battery using the AC Charger Micro USB 1.0 A (ZTDAC1) as an example.



- · Check the AC Charger's user manual before using it.
- Never connect the Micro USB plug if this device or the AC Charger are wet.

Connect the Micro USB plug of the AC Charger to the multipurpose Port on this device and insert the power plug into a household AC power socket.





Connecting the AC Charger (optional) improperly may cause serious damage to the device. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.




- The device can be used while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
- If the device receives an unstable power supply while charging, the Display may not function. If this happens, unplug the AC Charger from the device.
- While charging, the device may heat up. This is normal and should not affect the device's lifespan or performance. If the battery gets hotter than usual, the AC Charger may stop charging.
- If the device is not charging properly, take the device and the AC Charger to a SoftBank Shop.

After fully charging, disconnect the device from the AC Charger. First unplug the AC Charger from the device, and then unplug it from the electric socket.

Opening the battery charge status

When you charge the battery while the device is off, the following icons will show the current battery charge status:



Reducing the battery consumption

Your device provides options that help you save battery power. By customizing these options and deactivating features in the background, you can use the device longer between charges: The following are examples.

- When you are not using the device, switch to sleep mode by Pressing the Power/Screen lock Key.
- Cancel unnecessary applications with the task manager.
- Deactivate the Bluetooth feature.
- Deactivate the Wi-Fi feature.
- Deactivate auto-syncing of applications.
- Decrease the backlight time.
- Decrease the brightness of the Display.

Inserting a SD Card


Your device accepts SD Cards with maximum capacities of 64 GB. Depending on the SD Card manufacturer and type, some SD Cards may not be compatible with this device.



- Some SD Cards may not be fully compatible with the device. Using an incompatible card may damage the device or the SD Card, or corrupt the data stored in it.
- Use caution in inserting the SD Card right-side up.



- The device supports the FAT and the exFAT file systems for SD Cards. When inserting a card formatted in a different file system, the device asks to reformat the SD Card.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data shortens the lifespan of SD Cards.
- When inserting a SD Card into the device, the SD Card's file directory appears in the **SD card** folder.
- 1 Open the cover of the SD Card slot
- 2 Insert a SD Card with the gold-colored contacts facing downwards
- 3 Push the SD Card into the slot until it locks in place



Close the cover of the SD Card slot

Removing the SD Card

Before removing the SD Card, first unmount it for safe removal.

On the Home screen, Tap \Longrightarrow Settings \rightarrow General \rightarrow Storage \rightarrow Unmount SD card \rightarrow OK.

- 1 Open the cover of the SD Card slot
- **?** Push the SD Card until it disengages from the device, and then pull it out
- 3 Close the cover of the SD Card slot
- Do not remove the SD Card while the device is transferring or accessing information. Doing so can cause data to be lost or corrupted or damage to the SD Card or device. SoftBank Mobile Corp. is not responsible for losses that result from the misuse of damaged SD Cards, including the loss of data.

Formatting the SD Card

A SD Card formatted on a computer may not be compatible with the device. Format the SD Card on the device.


On the Home screen, Tap $\boxplus \exists \rightarrow \mathsf{Settings} \rightarrow \mathsf{General} \rightarrow \mathsf{Storage} \rightarrow \mathsf{Format} \, \mathsf{SD} \, \mathsf{card} \rightarrow \mathsf{Format} \, \mathsf{SD} \, \mathsf{card} \rightarrow \mathsf{Delete} \, \mathsf{all}.$



Before formatting the SD Card, remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on the device. The manufacturer's warranty does not cover loss of data resulting from user actions.

Turning the device on and off

Press & Hold the Power/Screen lock Key for a few seconds to turn on the device.





- Follow all warnings and directions from authorized personnel in areas where the use of wireless devices is restricted, such as airplanes and hospitals.
- Press & Hold the Power/Screen lock Key and Tap Airplane mode → OK to disable the wireless features.

To turn off the device, Press & Hold the Power/Screen lock Key, and then Tap **Power off** \rightarrow **OK**.

Initializing this device

The steps may differ depending on the connection to the network and the omitted settings etc.

- 1 On the "Welcome" screen, select the language that you want to use and Tap Start.
 - To change the accessibility settings, set Accessibility → Accessibility.
- 2 Set up Wi-Fi \rightarrow Next
- 3 Check the details of the licensing agreement, select the check box \rightarrow **Next**
- **4** Yes/No → Set up a Google account
 - If you already have a Google account, Tap **Yes**; if you do not have a Google account, Tap **No**.
- 5 If you are going to use your Google account to backup or restore, location settings, or use Google Play to receive the latest information, Tap ▶
 - If you want to create a new Google account, check the Terms of Service and Privacy Policy on the Finish account screen. I accept → enter the displayed text to create an account.
 - If you do not set up a Google account, the Setup screen for allowing the use of location information is displayed. Follow the instructions on the screen.
- 6 Set up payment information
 - Select the payment method and follow the instructions on the screen.
 - Tap SKIP to set a payment method later.
- 7 Enter your first and last name on the entry screen for the owner of the device → Tap ▶
- 8 Set up a Samsung account
 - Tap **Skip** to set an account later.
- 9 Set up a Dropbox account
 - Tap Skip to set an account later.
- 1() Finish

Locking and unlocking the device

When not in use, lock the device to prevent unwanted operation. Pressing the Power/ Screen lock Key turns off the Display and puts the device into lock mode. The device automatically gets locked if it is not used for a specified period.

To unlock the device, Press the Power/Screen lock Key or the Home Key when the Display is turned off, Tap anywhere on the screen, and then Flick your finger in any direction.

Adjusting the volume

Press the Volume Key up or down to adjust the sound volume when playing music or video.

Switching to silent mode

Use one of the following methods:

- Press & Hold the Volume Key down until it switches to silent mode.
- Press & Hold the Power/Screen lock Key, and then Tap Mute or Vibrate.
- Drag to underneath the Status bar and open the Notifications window, then Tap Sound or Vibrate.

Using the Display

Use only fingers to use the Display.



- Do not allow the Display to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the Display to malfunction.
- To avoid damaging the Display, do not Tap it with anything sharp or apply excessive pressure to it with your fingertips.



- The device may not recognize touch inputs close to the edges of the screen, which are outside of the touch input area.
- Leaving the Display idle for extended periods may result in afterimages (screen burn-in) or ghosting. Turn off the Display when you do not use the device.

Finger gestures

Tapping

To open an application, to select a menu item, to Press an on-screen button, or to enter a character using the on-screen keyboard, Tap it with a finger.




Touching & Holding

Touch & Hold an item for more than 2 seconds to access available options.



Dragging

To move an icon, thumbnail, or preview to a new location, Touch & Hold it and Drag it to the target position.



Double-Tapping


Double-Tapping is Tapping twice. Double-Tap on a webpage or image to zoom in on a part. Double-Tap again to return.



Basics


Flicking

Flick left or right on the Home screen or the Applications list to see another panel. Flick up or down to scroll through a webpage or a list, such as contacts.



Pinching

Spread two fingers apart (Pinch out) on a webpage, map, or image to zoom in a part. Pinch (Pinch in) to zoom out.



Palm motions


Use palm motions to control the device by touching the screen.

Before using motions, make sure the palm motion feature is activated. On the Home screen, Tap $\boxplus \exists \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Controls \rightarrow Palm motion$, and then Drag the Palm motion switch to the right.

Capture screen


Flick your hand across the screen from right to left or Flick from left to right to capture a screenshot.

The image is saved in **Gallery** \rightarrow **Screenshots**. It is not possible to capture a screenshot while using some applications.



Mute/pause

Cover the screen with a palm to mute the device or pause media playback.



Using Multi Window

Use this feature to run multiple applications on the screen at the same time.



Only applications on the Multi Window tray can run.

To use Multi Window, on the Home screen, Tap $\boxplus \exists \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Device \rightarrow Multi window$, and then Drag the Multi window switch to the right.


Opening Multi Window display

By enabling this feature, you can open a file from My File or the Video application or an email attachment and display the content automatically in a split screen when in full screen mode.


Launching applications in Multi Window

1 Drag your finger from the right edge (black part) of the screen towards the middle of the screen. Alternatively, Touch & Hold ◆

The Multi Window tray appears at the right side of the screen.



2 Touch & Hold an application icon on the Multi Window tray, and then Drag it to the screen. Release the application icon when the screen turns blue



3 Touch & Hold another application icon on the Multi Window tray, and then Drag it to a new location

Sharing content between applications

You can easily share content between applications, such as **Email** and **Internet**, by Dragging and dropping them.



Some applications may not support this feature.

1 Launch Email and Internet in Multi Window



2 Tap between the application windows, and then Tap 🕙



Tap the circle between application windows to access the following options:

- 📴 : Switch locations between Multi Window applications.
- Share items, such as images, text, or links, between application windows by Dragging and dropping them.
- Z: Maximize the window.
- X: Close the application.

3 Touch & Hold an item in the **Internet** window and Drag it to a location in the **Email** window



Notifications window

Notification Indicators appear on the Status bar at the top of the screen to report new messages, calendar events, device status, and more. Drag down from the Status bar to open the Notifications window. Scroll the list to see additional alerts. To close the Notifications window, Drag the bar up.

From the Notifications window, you can view your device's current settings or change them. You can select from more features by Dragging the settings icon to the left.

- Wi-Fi: Activate or deactivate the Wi-Fi feature.
- Location: Activate or deactivate the GPS feature.
- Sound/Vibrate/Mute: Activate or deactivate silent mode. You can vibrate or mute your device in silent mode.
- Screen rotation: Allow or prevent the interface from rotating when you rotate the device.
- Bluetooth: Activate or deactivate the Bluetooth feature.
- Mobile data: Activate or deactivate the data connection.
- Multi window: Set the device to use Multi Window.
- Screen Mirroring: Activate or deactivate the screen mirroring feature.
- Sync: Activate or deactivate auto-syncing of applications.
- Smart stay: Activate or deactivate the smart stay feature.
- Power saving: Activate or deactivate power-saving mode.
- Blocking mode: Activate or deactivate blocking mode. In blocking mode, the device will block notifications. To select which notifications will be blocked, Tap Settings → Device → Blocking mode.
- Airplane mode: Activate or deactivate flight mode.

To arrange the options on the Notifications window, open the Notifications window, Tap $\blacksquare \Rightarrow \mathscr{D}$, Touch & Hold the **Set quick setting buttons** item on the Notifications window, and then Drag the item to another location.

Home screen

The Home screen is the starting point to access all of the device's features. It displays Notification Indicators, widgets, shortcuts to applications, and others.

The Home screen can have multiple panels. To view other panels, scroll left or right.

Rearranging items

Adding an application icon

On the Home screen, Tap **!!!**, Touch & Hold an application icon, and then Drag it into a panel preview.

Moving an item

Touch & Hold an item and Drag it to a new location. To move it to another panel, Drag it to the side of the screen.

Deleting an item

Touch & Hold an item, and Drag it to the trash can that appears at the top of the Home screen. When the trash can turns red, release the item.

Rearranging panels

Adding a new panel

Pinch in on the screen and Tap \blacksquare .

Moving a panel

Pinch in on the screen, Touch & Hold a panel preview, and then Drag it to a new location.

Deleting a panel

Pinch in on the screen, Touch & Hold a panel preview, and then Drag it to the trash can at the top of the screen. Let go of the item once the trash can turns red.

Setting wallpaper

Set an image or photo stored in the device as wallpaper for the Home screen.

On the Home screen, Touch & Hold the empty area, Tap **Set wallpaper** → **Home screen**, and then select one of the following:

- Gallery: See photos taken by the device's camera or images downloaded from the Internet.
- Live wallpapers: See animated images.
- Photos: See images in Photos.
- Wallpapers: See wallpaper images.

Select an image, resize the frame if necessary, and then set it as wallpaper.

Using widgets

Widgets are small applications that provide convenient functions and information on your Home screen. To use them, add widgets from the widgets panel to the Home screen.



Some widgets connect to web services. Using a web-based widget may result in additional charges.

On the Home screen, Tap \boxdottimes \boxdot\text{Widgets}. Scroll left or right on the widgets panel, and then Touch & Hold a widget and Drag it to the Home screen. Put it on a location you want, resize it by Dragging the frame if necessary, and then Tap anywhere on the screen to save the location of the widget.

Applications list

The Applications list displays icons for all applications, including any new applications installed.

On the Home screen, Tap \Longrightarrow Apps tab.

To view other panels, scroll left or right.

Rearranging applications

This feature is available only in the customizable grid view.

Tap **∃** → **Edit**, Touch & Hold an application, and then Drag it to a new location. To move it to another panel, Drag it to the side of the screen.

Organizing with folders

Put related applications together in a folder for convenience.

Tap ∃ → Edit, Touch & Hold an application, and then Drag it to Create folder. Enter a folder name and then Tap OK. Put applications into the new folder by Dragging, and then Tap Save to save the arrangement.

Installing applications

Use application stores, such as GALAXY Apps, to download and install applications.

Uninstalling applications

Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Uninstall/disable apps, and then select an application to uninstall it.



Default applications that come with the device cannot be uninstalled.

Disabling applications

Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Uninstall/disable apps, and then select an application to disable it.

To enable applications, on the Applications list, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Show disable apps, select the applications, and then Tap Done.



- Downloaded applications and some default applications that come with the device cannot be disabled.
- When you use this feature, disabled applications disappear from the **Apps** screen but are still stored in the device.

Using applications

This device can run many different types of applications, ranging from media to Internet applications.

Opening an application

On the Home screen or the Applications list, Tap an application icon to open it.



Some applications are grouped into folders. Tap a folder \rightarrow an application to open it.

Opening from recently-used applications

Tap ☐ to open the list of recently-used applications.

Tap an application icon to open.

Exiting an application

Exit applications not in use to save battery power and maintain device performance.

Tap $\square \rightarrow$ Task manager, and then Tap End next to an application \rightarrow OK to close it. To close all running applications, Tap End all \rightarrow OK. Alternatively, Tap $\square \rightarrow$ Close all.

Entering text

Use the Samsung Japanese keyboard or the voice input feature to enter text.




Text entry is not supported in some languages. To enter text, you must change the input language to one of the supported languages.

Changing the keyboard type

Tap any text field, open the Notifications window, Tap **Select input method**, and then select the type of keyboard to use.

Using the Samsung Japanese keyboard



Changing the keyboard type


Touch & Hold ❖ , and then Tap ■ to change the keyboard type.

On the floating keyboard, Tap and Hold and move the floating keyboard to another location.

Basics

Handwriting

Touch & Hold ❖ , Tap ₺ , and then write a word with a finger. Predicted words are displayed. You can enter words faster if you select a predicted word.



Entering text by voice

Touch & Hold ❖ , and then Tap ⊎ to enter text by voice.

Activate the voice input feature and then speak into the microphone. The device displays what you speak.

To change the language or add languages for voice recognition, Tap **Default: English** (US) - no additional → Add or remove languages.

Copying and pasting

Touch & Hold over text, Drag or to select more or less text, and then Tap Copy to copy or Cut to cut. The selected text is copied to the clipboard.

To paste it into a text entry field, place the cursor at the point where it should be inserted, and then Tap \rightarrow Paste.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

Connect the device to a Wi-Fi network to use the Internet or share media files with other devices. (P.92)

Turning Wi-Fi on and off

Open the Notifications window, and then Tap Wi-Fi to turn it on or off.



- Your device uses a anharmonic frequency and is intended for use in all European countries. The WLAN can be operated in the EU without restriction indoors, but cannot be operated outdoors.
- Turn off Wi-Fi to save the battery when not in use.

Joining Wi-Fi networks

On the Applications list, Tap Settings \rightarrow Connections \rightarrow Wi-Fi, and then Drag the Wi-Fi switch to the right.

Select a network from the list of detected Wi-Fi networks, enter a password if necessary, and then Tap **Connect**. Networks that require a password appear with a lock icon. After the device connects to a Wi-Fi network, the device will automatically connect to it any time it is available.

Adding Wi-Fi networks

If the desired network does not appear in the networks list, Tap **Add Wi-Fi network** at the bottom of the networks list. Enter the network name in **Network SSID**, select the security type and enter the password if it is not a free public Wi-Fi, and then Tap **Connect**.

Forgetting Wi-Fi networks

Any network that has ever been used, including the current network, can be forgotten so the device will not automatically connect to it. Select the network in the networks list, and then Tap **Forget**.

Setting up accounts

Google applications, such as **Play Store**, require a Google account, and **GALAXY Apps** requires a Samsung account. Create Google and Samsung accounts to have the best experience with the device.

Adding accounts

To sign up for a Google account, on the Applications list, Tap Settings \rightarrow General \rightarrow Accounts \rightarrow Add account \rightarrow Google \rightarrow New. After that, follow the on-screen instructions to create a new account. If you open a Google application while not signed in to your Google account, you can setup an account in the same manner.

To sign in with an existing Google account, on the Applications list, Tap Settings \rightarrow General \rightarrow Accounts \rightarrow Add account \rightarrow Google \rightarrow Existing. After that, follow the onscreen instructions to complete the account setup.

More than one Google account can be used on the device.

Set up a Samsung account as well.

Deleting accounts

On the Applications list, Tap Settings → General → Accounts, select an account name under MY ACCOUNTS, select the account to delete, and then Tap Remove account.

Transferring files

Move audio, video, image, or other types of files from the device to the computer, or vice versa.

Connecting with Samsung Kies

Samsung Kies is a computer application that manages media contents and personal information with Samsung devices. Download the latest Samsung Kies from the Samsung website.

- 1 Connect the device to the computer using the Micro USB cable (commercially available)
 - Samsung Kies launches on the computer automatically. If Samsung Kies does not launch, double-click the Samsung Kies icon on the computer.
- 2 Transfer files between your device and the computer Refer to the Samsung Kies help for more information.

Connecting with Windows Media Player

Ensure that Windows Media Player is installed on the computer.

- 1 Connect the device to the computer using the Micro USB cable (commercially available)
- 2 Open Windows Media Player and synchronize music files

Connecting as a media device

- 1 Connect the device to the computer using the Micro USB cable (commercially available)
- 2 Open the Notifications window, and then Tap Connected as a media device → Media device (MTP)
 - Tap Camera (PTP) if your computer does not support Media Transfer Protocol (MTP) or not have any appropriate driver installed.
- 3 Transfer files between your device and the computer

Security Codes

An Optional Services landline Center Access Code is required for you to use this device. The 4-digit Center Access Code you received when you signed up is needed for subscribing to Internet fee-based information.

- Do not forget Center Access Code. If you forget this code, contact us for recovery. For details, contact Customer Service (P.117).
- Do not reveal Center Access Code. SoftBank Mobile Corp. is not liable for misuse or damages.

USIM PIN

PIN is a code for USIM Card. 9999 by default; enable USIM Card lock to restrict device use.

Changing USIM PIN (locking USIM Card)

You can set up the device so that it cannot be used when the power is turned on without entering a PIN (locking the USIM Card).

- 1 On the Applications list, Tap Settings
- 2 General → Security \rightarrow Set up SIM card lock
- 3 Lock SIM card → Enter current PIN → OK
 The USIM Card lock is now enabled and you can change PIN.
- **4** Change SIM PIN \rightarrow Enter current PIN \rightarrow OK \rightarrow Enter new PIN \rightarrow OK \rightarrow Reenter new PIN \rightarrow OK



- If PIN is entered incorrectly three times, PIN is locked and use of the device is restricted.
- To release PIN lock, contact Customer Service (P.117) to find out Personal Unblocking Key (PUK).
- If PUK is entered incorrectly 10 times, the USIM Card is locked and this device can no longer be used. In this case, a USIM Card must be reissued (for a fee) by a SoftBank Shop.


Securing the device

Prevent others from using or accessing personal data and information stored in the device by using the security features. The device requires an unlock code whenever unlocking it.

Setting a pattern

On the Applications list, Tap Settings \rightarrow Device \rightarrow Lock screen \rightarrow Screen lock \rightarrow Pattern.

Draw a pattern by connecting four dots or more, and then draw the pattern again to verify it. Set a backup unlock PIN to unlock the screen when you forget the pattern.



Setting a PIN

On the Applications list, Tap Settings \rightarrow Device \rightarrow Lock screen \rightarrow Screen lock \rightarrow PIN. Enter at least four numbers, and then enter the password again to verify it.

Setting a password

On the Applications list, Tap Settings \rightarrow Device \rightarrow Lock screen \rightarrow Screen lock \rightarrow Password.

Enter at least four characters including numbers and symbols, and then enter the password again to verify it.

Unlocking the device

Turn on the screen by Pressing the Power/Screen lock Key or the Home Key, and enter the unlock code.



If you forget the unlock code, take the device to a SoftBank Shop.

Updating software

You can update the device to the latest software.

Use a network to determine whether the device needs to be updated to the latest software and update it if it does.

- The device is designed to automatically perform some communications, such as updating software and maintaining a connection with the server.
- Updating software may take some time. You cannot use the device until the software update has completed.
- The software cannot be updated if there is insufficient available memory necessary for the update.
- Check that there is sufficient battery charge before executing a software update.
- Perform the software update in a place with good reception and do not move the device.
- You cannot use other features while updating the software.
- We recommend that you backup any important data before updating the software (some downloaded data may not be able to be backed up). While data that is saved with the device before the software update will stay as is, data may be lost depending on the status of the device (damaged, etc.). SoftBank Mobile Corp. takes no responsibility for any loss of data.
- Never remove the USIM Card or turn off the power during a software update. The update may fail if you do.
- If the software upgrade fails, the device may become unusable. Contact Customer Service if that happens.
- If the device does not restart after the software update, Hold down the Power/ Screen lock and Volume Key at the same time for longer than seven seconds to restart the device. If the device still does not restart contact Customer Assistance (Repairs/Lost Devices) (P.117).

Updating with Samsung Kies

Launch Samsung Kies and connect the device to the computer. Samsung Kies automatically recognizes the device and shows available updates in a dialogue box, if any. Click the Update button in the dialogue box to start updating. Refer to the Samsung Kies help for details on how to update.



- Do not turn off the computer or disconnect the Micro USB cable (commercially available) while the device is updating.
- While updating the device, do not connect other media devices to the computer. Doing so may interfere with the update process.

Updating with only the device

The device can be directly updated to the latest software by the firmware over-the-air (FOTA) service.







Use this application to view and share images or videos via Google's social network services. Tap **Photos** on the Applications list.

Select one of the following categories:

- ALL: View all the images or videos that are taken or downloaded to the device.
- **HIGHLIGHTS**: View images or videos grouped by date or album. Tap ≥ to view all of the images or videos in the group.

Then, select an image or video.

Bookmarks

To bookmark the current webpage, Tap \Leftrightarrow **Save**.

To open a bookmarked webpage, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Bookmarks, and then select one.

Bluetooth

To activate Bluetooth, on the Applications list, Tap Settings \rightarrow Connections \rightarrow Bluetooth, and then Drag the Bluetooth switch to the right.

Pairing with other Bluetooth devices

On the Applications list, Tap Settings \rightarrow Connections \rightarrow Bluetooth \rightarrow Scan, and detected devices are listed. Select the device you want to pair with, and then accept the autogenerated passkey on both devices to confirm.

Sending and receiving data

Many applications support data transfer via Bluetooth. An example is **Gallery**. On the Application list, open **Gallery**, select an image, Tap

→ **Bluetooth**, and then select one of the Bluetooth devices. After that, accept the Bluetooth authorization request from the other device to send the image.

Screen Mirroring



Use this application to listen to music.

Tap Music on the Applications list.

Playing music

Select a category from the tab at the top of the screen, and then select a song to play. The song that is currently being played on the basic music player (operation panel) is displayed at the bottom of the screen. Tap the left side of the basic music player to open the music player screen.



To listen to songs at equal volume levels, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Settings \rightarrow Smart volume.



When **Smart volume** is activated, the volume may end up louder than the device volume level. Use caution to avoid long-term exposure to loud sounds to prevent damage to your hearing.



Smart volume may not be activated for some files.

To set a personalized sound while listening to songs with a headset, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Settings \rightarrow Adapt Sound \rightarrow On. When you turn the volume up to level 14 or higher, the adapt sound option is not applied to music playback. If you turn the volume down to level 13 or lower, the option is reapplied.

Setting a song as an alarm tone

To use the currently-playing song as an alarm tone, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Set as alarm tone, set any other settings if necessary, and then Tap **Done**.

Creating playlists

Create your own selection of songs.

Tap **Playlists**, and then Tap **∃** → **Create playlist**. Enter a title and Tap **OK**. Tap **Add tracks**, select songs to include, and then Tap **Done**.

To add the currently-playing song to a playlist, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow Add$ to playlist.

Playing music by mood

Play music grouped by mood. The playlist is automatically created.

On the Music List screen, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Music square, and select a cell that matches your mood. Or select multiple cells by Dragging your finger.



If there are no songs that match the selected mood, cell selection is disabled.

Camera

Use this application to take photos or videos. Use **Gallery** to view photos and videos taken with the device's camera. (P. 67)

Tap Camera on the Applications list.



Make sure that the lens is clean. Otherwise, the device may not work properly in some modes that require high resolutions.


Camera etiquette

- Do not take photos or videos of other people without their permission.
- Do not take photos or videos where legally prohibited.
- Do not take photos or videos in places where you may violate other people's privacy.

Taking photos

Taking a photo

Tap to take a photo.



Camera mode

Several photo effects are available.

Tap MODE, and then scroll up or down the screen at the right side of the screen.

- Auto: Use this to allow the camera to evaluate the surroundings and optimize the color and brightness for the photo.
- Beauty face: Take a photo with lightened faces for nicer-looking expressions.
- Sound & shot: Use this to take a photo with sound.

Tap to take a photo. The device records a few seconds of audio after taking a photo.



While taking photos in this mode, sound is recorded by the internal microphone.

• Panorama: Take a photo composed of many photos strung together.

To get the best shot, follow these tips.

- Move the camera slowly in one direction.
- Keep the camera's viewfinder within the guide frame.
- Avoid taking photos of a subject in front of unrecognizable backgrounds, such as empty skies or plain walls.
- **Sports**: Use this setting for fast-moving subjects.
- Night: Use this setting for images taken in darker conditions.

Panoramic photos

A panoramic photo is a wide landscape image consisting of multiple shots.

Tap **MODE** → **Panorama**.

Tap and move the camera in one direction. When two panorama guide frames are aligned, the camera automatically takes another shot in a panoramic sequence. To stop shooting, Tap .

If the viewfinder is out of the direction, the device stops shooting.

Applying effects

Use the effects to take unique photos or videos.

Tap **to** display the effects that are available for that mode.





Zooming in and out



You can use one of the following methods to zoom the camera in or out:

- Use the Volume button.
- Spread two fingers apart on the screen to zoom in, and Pinch to zoom out.



This feature is not available for some modes.

Share shot

Tap $\triangleright \rightarrow \blacktriangleleft$ to share images that you've taken.

- Share shot: Send a photo directly to another device via Wi-Fi Direct.
- Buddy photo share: Set the device to recognize a person's face that you have tagged in a photo and send it to that person.
- Remote viewfinder: Set a device to control the camera remotely.



This feature is not available for some modes.

Controlling the camera remotely

Set a device as a viewfinder to control the camera remotely.

Tap $\triangleright \rightarrow \square \rightarrow \square \rightarrow \square$ Remote viewfinder, and then connect the device and the camera using Wi-Fi Direct. Tap $\bigcirc \square$ to take a photo remotely using the device as a viewfinder.

Configuring settings for Camera

Tap to configure settings for Camera. The available options vary depending on the mode used.

- Photo size / Video size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. But it takes up more memory.
- Metering: Select a metering method. Center-weighted measures background light in the center of the scene. Matrix averages the entire scene. Spot measures the light value at a specific location.
- Location tag: Attach a GPS location tag to the photo.



- To improve GPS signals, avoid shooting in locations where the signal may be obstructed, such as between buildings or in low-lying areas, or in poor weather conditions.
- Your location may appear on your photos when you upload them to the Internet. To avoid this, deactivate the GPS tag setting.
- Review: Set the device to show photos or videos after taking them.
- Volume key: Set the device to use the Volume Key to control the shutter or zoom function.
- Timer: Use this for delayed-time shots.
- White balance: Select an appropriate white balance, so images have a true-to-life color range. The settings are designed for specific lighting situations. These settings are similar to the color temperature for white-balance exposure in professional cameras.
- **Brightness**: Change the brightness.
- Guidelines: Display viewfinder guides to help composition when selecting subjects.
- Volume control: Set the camera to take photos with voice commands.
- Contextual filename: Set the camera to display contextual tags. Activate this to use Tag Buddy in Gallery.
- Save as flipped: Invert the image to create a mirror-image of the original scene. This feature is available only when using the front camera.
- Storage: Select the memory location for storage.
- **Reset**: Reset the camera settings.
- Help: Access help information for using the camera.

Shortcuts

Reorganize shortcuts for easy access to the camera's various options.

Tap ≥ and Touch & Hold a shortcut icon.

Touch & Hold an option and Drag it to a slot at the top of the screen.

Gallery

Use this application to view images and videos.

Tap Gallery on the Applications list.

Viewing images

Opening **Gallery** displays available folders. When another application, such as **Email**, saves an image, the **Download** folder is automatically created to contain the image. Likewise, capturing a screenshot automatically creates the **Screenshots** folder. Select a folder to open it.

In a folder, images are displayed by creation date. Select an image to view it in full screen.

Scroll left or right to view the next or previous image.

Zooming in and out

Use one of the following methods:

- · Double-Tap anywhere to zoom in.
- Spread two fingers apart on any place to zoom in. Pinch or Double-Tap anywhere to zoom out.

Playing videos

Video files show the icon on the preview. Select a video to watch it and Tap .

Trimming segments of a video

Select a video and Tap . Move the start bracket to the desired starting point, move the end bracket to the desired ending point, Tap **Done**, enter the new file name, and then Tap **OK**.

Editing images

When viewing an image, Tap **1** and use the following functions:

- Favorite: Add to the favorites list.
- Slideshow: Start a slideshow with the images in the current folder.
- **Photo frame**: Use this to add a frame and a note to an image. The edited image is saved in the **Photo frame** folder.
- Copy to clipboard: Copy to clipboard.
- **Print**: Print the image by connecting the device to a printer. Some printers may not be compatible with the device.
- Rename: Rename the file.
- Buddy photo share: Send the image to a person whose face is tagged in the image.
- Rotate left: Rotate anticlockwise.
- Rotate right: Rotate clockwise.
- Crop: Resize the blue frame to crop and save the image in it.
- Set as: Set the image as wallpaper or a contact image.
- Details: View image details.
- **Settings**: Change the Gallery settings.

Favorite images

When viewing an image, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Favorite to add the image to the favorites list.

Deleting images

You can use one of the following methods to delete an image:

- In a folder, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Select item, select images, and then Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ OK.
- When viewing an image, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow OK$.

Sharing images

You can use one of the following methods to share an image:

- In a folder, Tap → Select item, select images, and then Tap

 to send them to
 others or share them via social network services.

Setting as wallpaper

When viewing an image that you want to set as the wallpaper, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Set as to set the image as wallpaper or as a contact image.

Tagging faces

When viewing an image that you want to tag, Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ Settings \rightarrow Tags, and then check Face tag. A yellow frame appears around the recognized face.

Tap the face, Tap Add name, and then select or add a contact.

When the face tag appears on an image, Tap the face tag and use available options, such as sending messages.



Face detection may fail depending on the face angle, face size, skin color, facial expression, light conditions, or accessories the subject is wearing.

Using Tag buddy

Tap **∃** → **Settings** → **Tags** → **Tag buddy**, and then Drag the **Tag buddy** switch to the right to display a contextual tag (weather, location, person, and date) when opening an image.

Organizing with folders

Create a folder to organize images or videos stored in the device. You can copy or move files from one folder to another.

To create a new folder, Tap . Enter a name for the folder, Tap **OK**, and then check images or videos. Touch & Hold any selected image or video, Drag it to the new folder, and then Tap **Done**. Tap **Copy** to copy or **Move** to move.



Use this application to play video files.

Tap Video on the Applications list.

Playing videos

Select a video to play.



Deleting videos

Tap $\blacksquare \rightarrow$ **Delete**, select videos, and then Tap **Done**.

Sharing videos

Using Popup Video player

Use this feature to use other applications without closing the video player. While watching videos, Tap to use the pop-up player.





- Open via the home key: Set the device to open S Voice when you Press the Home Key twice.
- Voice wake-up: Set the device to start voice recognition by saying a wake up command while using S Voice.
- Check missed events: Set the device to open messages, or events when S Voice is launched by Pressing the headset button.
- Home address: Enter your home address to use location information with the voice command feature.

Formatting a SD Card permanently deletes all data from it.

Troubleshooting

Before contacting Customer Service or contacting SoftBank Shop, please attempt the following solutions.

When you turn on your device or while you are using the device, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

- Password: When the device lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the device.
- PIN: When using the device for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the USIM Card.
- PUK: Your USIM Card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
- PIN2: When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with your USIM Card. For more details, contact Customer Service or contact SoftBank Shop.

Your device displays network or service error messages

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception.
 Move to another area and try again. While moving, error messages may appear repeatedly.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. For more details, contact Customer Service or contact SoftBank Shop.

Your device does not turn on

 When the battery is completely discharged, your device will not turn on. Charge the battery completely before turning on the device.

The Display responds slowly or improperly

- If you attach a protective cover or optional accessories to the Display, the Display may not function properly.
- If you are wearing gloves, if your hands are not clean while touching the Display, or if you Tap the Display with sharp objects or your fingertips, the Display may malfunction.
- · The Display may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.
- Restart your device to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your device software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the Display is scratched or damaged, contact Customer Service or contact SoftBank Shop.

Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close applications or turn off the device and turn it on again. If your device is frozen and unresponsive, Press & Hold the Power/Screen lock Key and the Volume Key down simultaneously for more than 7 seconds to restart it.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset. On the Applications list, Tap Settings \rightarrow General \rightarrow Backup and reset \rightarrow Factory data reset \rightarrow Reset device \rightarrow Delete all. Before performing the factory data reset, remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on the device.

If the problem is still not resolved, contact Customer Service or contact SoftBank Shop.

A cellular network or the Internet is often disconnected or audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the device's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception.
 You may have connectivity problems due to issues with the communication base station.
- When using the device while moving, wireless network services may be disabled due to issues with the network.

The battery icon is empty

Your battery is low. Charge the battery.

The device does not charge

- Ensure that the AC Charger (optional) is connected properly.
- If the battery terminals are dirty, the battery may not charge properly or the device may turn off. Wipe both gold-colored contacts and try charging the battery again.

The battery promptly discharges

- When you expose the battery to very cold or very hot temperatures, the useful charge may be reduced.
- Battery consumption increases when you use messaging features or some applications, such as games or the Internet.
- The battery is consumable and the useful charge will get shorter over time.

Your device is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

Error messages appear when opening the camera

Photo quality is poorer than the preview

Error messages appear when opening media files

If you receive error messages or media files do not play when you open them on your device, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a computer or deleting files from your device.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRM-protected, ensure that you have the appropriate license or key to play the file.
- Ensure that the file formats are supported by the device. If a file format is not supported, such as DivX or AC3, install an application that supports it. To confirm the file formats that your device supports, http://www.samsung.com.
- Your device supports photos and videos captured with the device. Photos and videos captured by other devices may not work properly.
- Some content circulated on the Internet, such as notification ringtones, videos, or wallpapers, may not work properly.

Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your device.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to.
- Ensure that your device and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

If the tips above do not resolve the problem, contact Customer Service or contact SoftBank Shop.

A connection is not established when you connect the device to a computer

- Ensure that the Micro USB Cable (commercial item) you are using is compatible with your device.
- Ensure that you have the proper driver installed and updated on your computer.
- Ensure that you have Samsung Kies or Windows Media Player 10 or higher installed on your computer.

Your device cannot find your current location

GPS signals may be obstructed in some locations, such as indoors. Set the device to use Wi-Fi or a mobile network to find your current location in these situations.

Data stored on the device has been lost

Always make backup copies of all important data stored on the device. Otherwise, you cannot restore data if it is corrupted or lost. SoftBank Mobile Corp. is not responsible for the loss of data stored on the device.

A small gap appears around the outside of the device case

- This gap is a necessary manufacturing feature and some minor rocking or vibration of parts may occur.
- Over time, friction between parts may cause this gap to expand slightly.
