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
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
# 1 Introduction

## **Parts & Functions**



- Front Camera
  - Capture your own portrait, etc.
- 2 Light Sensor
  - Detects ambient light level and adjusts Display brightness.
- 3.5mm Headphone Port
  - Connect headphones.
- 4 External Device Port
  - Connect Micro USB Cable.
- 6 Mic
- 6 Display (Touchscreen)
  - Touch to operate tablet.
- Power Key
  - Toggle Display on/off.
  - Long-Press for power on/off.
- 8 Volume Key
  - Adjust volume.
- 9 Rear Camera
  - Capture still images and video.
- Card Slot / Card Slot Cover
  - Install microSD Card/USIM Card.
- Speaker
  - Ringtone, music, etc. emit here.
- Note
- Avoid removing USIM Card or microSD Card between powering on and until tablet is operable. May prevent correct operation.
- If tablet stops operating, no longer accepts input, or freezes, hold down Power Key for 13 seconds to force-restart tablet.

## Installing USIM Card/microSD Card



- 1 Open Card Slot Cover
- 2 Insert USIM Card gently (metal contact up) until it clicks in place
- 3 Insert microSD Card¹ gently (metal terminals up) until it clicks in place
- 4 Close Cover
- 1 Purchase separately

## **Handling USIM Card**

- Customer is responsible for any damage caused by inserting USIM Card in an otherbrand IC card reader, etc. SoftBank Mobile Corp. is not responsible in such case.
- Always keep the IC chip (metal) clean.
- Wipe clean with a dry, soft cloth.
- Avoid applying labels. May damage USIM Card.
- See instructions included with USIM Card for handling.


- USIM Card is the property of SoftBank Mobile Corp.
- USIM is replaceable (at cost) in case of loss/damage.
- Return USIM Card to SoftBank Mobile Corp. when cancelling subscription.

## **Charging with AC Charger (Optional Accessory)**


AC Charger is an optional accessory. Be sure to use ZTDAD1 specified by SoftBank Mobile Corp.

The following explains how to charge tablet using ZTDAD1.

- See User Guide for AC Charger.
- Never connect Micro USB plug when tablet or AC Charger are wet.
- 1 Insert AC Charger (optional accessory) in External Device Port, and then plug in AC Charger

· Check charging progress on Display.

## Charging

#### Charging Conditions

Low-temperature conditions affect charging performance.

Use AC Charger (optional accessory) in temperatures from 5°C to 35°C.

#### **Use Specified Optional Accessory**

Charge using AC Charger (optional accessory) compatible with tablet. Avoid bending cable or forcing Micro USB plug. May cause damage.

#### Tablet or AC Charger (Optional Accessory) Becoming Warm

Tablet or AC Charger (optional accessory) may become warm during charging, but is not a malfunction. However, becoming extremely hot may be a sign of abnormality; immediately discontinue use.

#### Caution with Extended Periods of Use

Tablet may become hot with extended use or while charging, especially in hightemperature conditions. Use with caution. Extended skin contact may cause lowtemperature burns.

# 2 Text Entry


## **Keyboards**

Use onscreen keyboards for text entry.

In 10 Key Keyboard, multiple characters are assigned to each key. In QWERTY and Japanese Syllabary Keyboards, a single character is assigned to each key.

To toggle between 10 Key, QWERTY, and Japanese Syllabary Keyboards, in a shown keyboard, Tap Menu → 10 Key, QWERTY, or Japanese Syllabary.



## **Entering Katakana**

  - · Text is entered.

## **Entering Alphabet**

To enter keitai in 10 Key Keyboard:

- 1 Check that character set is single-byte alphanumerics
  - · Check Status Bar for na icon.
- 2 jkl (2 times) → def (2 times) → ghi (3 times) → tuv (1 time) → abc (1 time) → ghi (3 times) → 確定
  - · Text is entered

# Entering Emoticons, Symbols, & Template Phrases

- 1 In keyboard, Menu
- 2 Emoticons, Symbols, or Templates → Tap emoticon/symbol/template
  - · Emoticon/symbol/template is entered.
  - · Tap category name to change categories.

## Flick Input

In 10 Key Keyboard, Flick keys for target characters.

To enter "k-" syllables (ka-gyo) in hiragana or katakana:

1 Flick か up, down, left, or right

· Character in direction Flicked is entered.

## **Pasting Cut or Copied Text**

To cut/copy and paste text in 10 Key Keyboard:

- 1 Touch & Hold entered text
- 2 Drag / to select string of text
- 4 Tap where to paste → **•** → PASTE
  - · Cut/copied text is pasted.

# 3 Internet Connectivity

## Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network

Select from detected Wi-Fi networks

- 1 In Home Screen, Settings → ooo for Wi-Fi ( ooo)
  - · Wi-Fi is enabled
  - · Tap to disable Wi-Fi ( ).
- 2 Wi-Fi
  - · Wi-Fi settings appear.
- 3 Tap access point → Enter password → Connect
  - · Tablet is connected.
  - Password (indicated by WEP, WPA, KEY, etc.) may be found on a label on your Wi-Fi router. For details, contact the vendor of the router. For public wireless LAN services, inquire about the password with your ISP.
  - · Omit password entry for unprotected access points.

### Note

- To connect to a Wi-Fi network that uses a hidden SSID,

   → Add network → Enter required network information (SSID etc.) to connect.
- Enabling Wi-Fi increases power consumption. To save battery power, disable Wi-Fi when not in use.

## Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network (WPS)

If your wireless router supports WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup), use WPS to quickly connect to a Wi-Fi network

  - · Wi-Fi is enabled.
  - · Tap to disable Wi-Fi ( ).

# 4 Tethering Option

## **About Tethering Option**

Use tablet like a Wi-Fi router to connect to the Internet from a PC or game device.

- Requires separate subscription.
- Use after confirming that tablet is updated to the latest software.

  - · Tethering Option window opens.
  - · If Terms of Agreement appear, follow onscreen prompts.

## **How to Use Tethering Option (Japanese)**

- 1 In Home Screen, Tethering
  - · Tethering Option window opens.
- 2 Help
  - · Help window opens.
- 3 Follow onscreen prompts
  - · A description of each item appears.

## **Installing Applications**

Install in any of the following ways.

A Google account is required to download applications. For details on adding an account, see "Adding a Google Account" (p. 88).

  - · Application is installed.
- To copy and install application
- 1 Copy application to tablet
  - · Copy to any folder.
- 2 In Home Screen, Tools → App Installer → Select application → INSTALL
  - · If confirmation appears, follow onscreen prompts.
  - · Application is installed.
- Note
- Some applications are incompatible with tablet, and will not operate correctly or can damage tablet's system. Only download applications from trusted sources.

## **Erasing Application Cache**

Periodically erasing application cache allows tablet to operate more smoothly.

- 2 Show ALL tab → Clear cache
  - · Cache is erased.
- Note
- After erasing cache, applications may need to load data again, etc.

## **Uninstalling Applications**

- 1 In Home Screen, Touch & Hold application → Drag to
- 2 ok
  - · Application is uninstalled.
- Note
- Some applications are permanently installed.

# 6 Messaging

## **Types of Mail**

#### S! Mail

Exchange messages with S! Mail-compatible SoftBank handsets and email compatible devices (other mobiles, PCs, etc.) beyond SMS character entry limit; attach media files.

#### **SMS**

Exchange short messages (up to 160 single-byte characters) using phone numbers as addresses.

#### **Gmail**

Gmail is Google's webmail service. Tablet automatically syncs with Gmail.

 A Google account is required to use Gmail. For details on adding an account, see "Adding a Google Account" (p. 88).

#### **Email**

Use email (POP3/IMAP4) on tablet.

- Set up an email account beforehand.
- Sending/receiving email on tablet syncs tablet and mail server; sent/received messages (in the POP protocol, received messages only) are also accessible from PCs.

## S! Mail Initial Setup

When activating mail for the first time, complete setup to send/receive S! Mail using Wi-Fi.

#### 1 In Home Screen, Mail

· Wi-Fi settings appear.

#### 2 Set Now

- · Wi-Fi connection setup is complete and folder list opens.
- · To set up later, Tap Set Later.

#### Note

- If you Tap Set Later at initial startup, complete Wi-Fi setup for S! Mail later as follows.
   In Folder list, ♣ → Send/Receive Settings → Wi-Fi Connection
- Transmission fees apply when sending international S! Mail messages even if Wi-Fi is in use
- To receive S! Mail messages using Wi-Fi even when Display is completely dark (Screen lock active), disable Wi-Fi sleep policy in Wi-Fi settings.

### Folder List/Thread List

View mail in folder list or thread list.

Folder list is described in the User Guide.

### Switching between Folder List and Thread List


- 1 In Home Screen, Mail
- 2 Tap name of current list view (Folder list/Thread list) → Tap name of list view to change to
  - · List view switches.

### **Folder List**

Messages are sorted and saved in folders such as Inbox and Sent Box.

#### **Thread List**

Sent and received S! Mail/SMS is displayed sorted by recipient. When viewing messages exchanged with Yamamoto-san, messages are displayed as a conversation with Yamamoto-san within a single thread.

- 6 Send → Send
  - · S! Mail is sent.
  - · Failed S! Mail messages are saved as drafts.

## **Sending SMS**

- 3 Tap recipient
  - · After setting recipient, Tap ooo to check recipient's phone number.
  - · To delete recipient, Tap \* ooo and then \*.
- 4 Tap Compose SMS field → Enter text
- 5 Send → Send
  - · SMS is sent.
  - · Failed SMS messages are saved as drafts.

## Sending Decore Mail by S! Mail

### **Using a Template**

Choose from a variety of designs to decorate mail.

- 4 Send → Send
  - · Decore mail is sent.

#### **Decorating S! Mail**

- 1 While entering message text, ★
  - · Message is ready to be decorated.
- 2 Tap decorating method → Follow onscreen prompts
  - · Decorate while entering message text.

## Opening & Replying to S! Mail/SMS

Tablet receives S! Mail/SMS messages automatically by default. Optionally, retrieve messages manually, and also retrieve all messages stored on the server.

#### **Opening New S! Mail/SMS**

When message arrives, new message notice and Notification Indicator appear.

- 1 Read
  - · S! Mail/SMS message window opens.
  - To open new message from Notification Indicator, Drag Notification Bar down for Notifications Window, then Tap corresponding notification.
  - · For two or more new messages, folder list opens.

#### Note

Set spam filtering to save messages from senders not in Phonebook to spam mail.
 New mail notification does not appear. To check messages saved to spam mail:

In Home Screen, Mail → Spam Box

· If confirmation appears, follow onscreen instructions.

#### **Retrieving S! Mail/SMS Manually**

  - · Mail is received.

#### **Retrieving Server Mail**

- 1 In Home Screen, Mail → II → Handle Server Mail
- 2 Receive whole content for all server mails / Receive subject and sender for all server mails
  - · Server mail is received.

  - · Message is sent.






