- 2. 6 teams will be chosen from the team entries, who will then be free to conduct research^{*2} with Vodafone K.K. handsets for the 3 month period of 1 August to 31 October.
- 3. Research results will be presented on 21 November (at the National Museum of Emerging Science and Innovation), and a Grand Prix team will be chosen from among the 6 teams.

The Grand Prix team will receive a prize of 200,000 yen and a field trip to the United Kingdom. The field trip is scheduled to include exchange with U.K. high school students and other cultural activities.
