# **Battery & USIM Card Installation**

Do not apply excessive force to Battery or USIM Card.

### Inserting

USIM Card must be inserted to use handset.

### **Remove Battery Cover**



• Use notch to lift Battery Cover. Push up Battery Cover along edges to remove it. Use tab to pull out USIM Tray

# Replace Battery Cover

### Removing

- Take care not to lose removed USIM Card.

### After USIM Card Removal (Contract Termination, Handset Upgrade/ Replacement, Repairs, Etc.)

### About Battery

- Charge Battery at least once every six months; uncharged Battery may die or affect files/settings.

- Clean Battery terminals and charging terminals with a dry cotton swab, etc.

### **PIN Lock**

### **Canceling PIN Lock**

- Contact SoftBank Customer Support, General Information (**P.9-1**) for your Personal Unblocking Key (PUK) and follow these steps:

  - Do not forget PUK; write it down if necessary.

### PUK Lock

 Entering incorrect PUK ten consecutive times activates PUK Lock, disabling handset. For recovery, USIM Card must be reissued at a SoftBank Shop (fees apply).
